




## Program Details:

On 15<sup>th</sup> August 1947, India gained independence from British rule. However, it did not have its own constitution. The Constituent Assembly, under the chairmanship of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, was formed to draft a permanent constitution. After nearly 2 years, 11 months, and 18 days of deliberations, the Constitution was adopted on 26<sup>th</sup> November 1949 and came into force on 26<sup>th</sup> January 1950. The date was chosen to honor the declaration of Purna Swaraj (complete independence) made by the Indian National Congress in 1930.

26<sup>th</sup> January symbolizes the spirit of independent India and the democratic values enshrined in the Constitution. It reflects the unity in diversity of the country, where citizens of various cultures, languages, and religions come together to celebrate a common identity. It is a reminder of the fundamental duties and rights that every citizen holds. The most prominent celebration takes place in New Delhi at Rajpath, where the President of India hoists the national flag. A grand Republic Day parade is held, showcasing India's military strength, cultural diversity, and technological achievements.
